**STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL & TUITION REIMBURSEMENT:**

A notice of cancellation must be in writing, and a withdrawal may be effectuated by your written notice or by your conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, your lack of attendance.

**INITIAL CANCELLATION PERIOD:** If notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later, ISDI will refund 100 percent of the amount paid for tuition charges, less a two-hundred-dollar (\$200) cancellation fee.

- After the Initial Cancellation Period (described above), you may withdraw from the program by submitting a formal withdrawal, in writing, to the Director of Admissions, Admissions Office of ISDI Digital University located at 101 West Santa Clara Street, San Jose, CA 95113. All withdrawal notices shall be effective on the day they are received by the Admissions Office. Any notice of withdrawal shall be subject to the following refund policy:
- A \$250 cancellation fee PLUS a Pro-Rata charge will be applied, as calculated below:
  1. Pro-Rata calculation amount: Tuition multiplied by (# of hours material provided / # total program hours).
  2. Refund amount: Total amount currently paid minus \$250 minus Pro-Rata calculation amount.  
No refund is available once 60% of the program has been disseminated.
  3. ISDI shall refund any credit balance on your account within 45 calendar days after the date of your withdrawal from the educational program in which you were enrolled.
- If you have received federal student financial aid funds, you are entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds, subject to the cancellation fees outlined. If you default on a federal or state loan, both of the following may occur:
  1. The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may take action against you, including applying any income tax refund to which you may be entitled to reduce the balance owed on the loan.
  2. You may not be eligible for any other federal financial aid at another institution or other government financial assistance until the loan is repaid.
- If you have obtained a loan to pay for the MIB program through an ISDI affiliated entity, you will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund.

### Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.
